

FALL MEETING ANNOUNCEMENT AND CALL FOR PAPERS NOVEMBER 7-9, 1996 ATLANTIC BEACH, NC

The Fall SEERS meeting will be held in conjunction with AERS at the Royal Pavillion Resort in Atlantic Beach, NC. Don Hoss (National Marine Fisheries Service) is the local arrangements Chair (919-728-8746). A block of ocean-view rooms is reserved at the Royal Pavillion Resort, Salter Path Rd, Pine Knoll Shores, Atlantic Beach, NC 28512, (919)726-5188 or 1-800-533-3700. Rates are \$60 per day for a double room (plus 9% tax). Add \$6 per person for more than 2 occupants/room. This rate is guaranteed if reservations are made before October 14 (mention that you are from SEERS or AERS). Registration begins on Thursday, November 7 at 6:00 PM, followed by a poster session/social. Oral presentations begin on Friday morning and continue through Saturday noon. A special session on the ichthyotoxic "phantom" dinoflagellate, *Pfiesteria piscicida*, will take place on Saturday. The registration fee is \$30 for regular members and \$20 for students, and includes the socials and Friday evening banquet. Extra banquet tickets cost \$15. Abstracts are required for both oral and poster presentations (see instructions for abstract submission below). The maximum time for oral presentations is 12 min., with 3 min. for questions. The SEERS contingent will again have two student competitions; the Best Student Paper Award for oral presentations and the Best Undergraduate Poster Award. Students wishing to be eligible for these awards must be a member of SEERS (can join at the meeting). In any case, the abstract should have the following format:

Abstract -- Limited to 250 words.

- (4) if the student will compete for the Best Student Paper Award (oral) or Best Undergraduate Poster Award,
- (5) for students entering the Award competitions, include the name and phone number or e-mail address of a faculty member or Department Head that will verify his or her student status.


DEADLINE FOR ABSTRACT SUBMISSION IS OCTOBER 11, 1996.

Poster Information: The top of the poster should have title and author(s) in large lettering no less than 2.5 cm high. Each poster should include an abstract. The Introduction (optional) and Conclusion sections should contain any required text. Keep wording down to a minimum and increase the use of figures/data. This is to encourage interaction between poster author(s) and the browsing audience. Typed material should be in 3/8" (1 cm) or greater size lettering. We suggest using the capital font of an Orator element and bold print. Poster space is limited, so poster configuration should be no larger than 4 X 6 feet (1.3 X 2 m). Modulating the poster into different sections (pieces) will aid fitting it into a confined space. Charts, graphs, and photographs should be mounted on medium weight (poster) board. Minimum size for all graphics should be 8" X 10" (20.4 X 25.5 cm). Wording and graphic lines should be dense black or bolded, and symbols should be large and easily distinguished. All captions should be brief and the labels few and concise.

A program will be sent to SEERS members, and abstracts will be available at registration.

Directions to the Meeting

In Morehead City: Turn right onto the Atlantic Beach Causeway From I-95 or Rt. 17: Take Rt. 70 southeast to Morehead City. Turn right onto Rt. 58 and go 3 miles. The Royal Pavillion is on the left. and follow it to Atlantic Beach. You are almost there!
